The first one will be on November 26th. 12/24 is out. We will follow the study schedule from the study guide. We will have examples of commercial styles and go over the history and style guidelines. If anyone has a homebrew version, we can also judge it. I suggest you follow this link to the brewers' association site to look at the materials and download the study guide.
